- The 1565 Siege;
- Founded 1566;
- 440 Years Old;

- •City built for 15,000 population
- •24,000 living before WWII,
- sub-standard housing
- densely populated
- •1940 Exodus from Valletta
- Post War Urban Regeneration

- •Late 60s Exodus (economic boom)
- •7,500 current population
 •80,000 (20%) living in the immediate Harbour Areas from St. Julians to Kalkara
 •Rehabilitation Policy in the 90s
