



Workshop (WS) 02-20:

“New EU Port and Customs Policy, Impact on Ports: What Will the Future Bring for the Trade with non-EU Countries?”



Dear Partners:

Following is a brief Manual of information you need to know having arrived in Riga for the planned PORT-NET workshop in end November.

Currency

One of the first things to do after you have landed at the Riga International Airport and gone through the passport control is getting some cash in local currency (lats). We recommend getting some cash at the airport for paying a taxi although electronic cards are sometimes accepted too (the exchange rate 1 EUR = 0.71 LVL).

The currency exchange rate is somewhat better in the city. Payment cards are widely accepted in all hotels, stores, restaurants, bars, etc.

Transportation

In order to get from the Riga International Airport to the hotel “*Domina Inn*” (Address Pulkveža Brieža 11, <http://www.dominahotels.com>) you can use a taxi or public transportation. The distance from the Airport to city center is about 15 km.

A normal fare for a taxi would be LVL 8-10 and the drive lasts approx. 20 minutes.

You can also take a bus (No 22 A). The fare is LVL 0.35 and it takes 30-40 minutes to get to the final stop *Katedrāle* (Orthodox Russian Cathedral) from where you can walk (10 min) to the hotel (see the city map).

Weather conditions

We suggest you dress warmly and have coats with you coming to Riga in late November. Air temperature can vary from +5 C to –5 C. Hopefully, we have a spell of warm weather during seminar days!

Hotel

Domina Inn Riga is conveniently located in the quiet centre of Riga- in the Art Nouveau and embassies’ neighborhood, within a walking distance to the Old Town and to main landmarks of the City.
